COURSE MATERIAL / SYLLABUS

I. Description of Content:

Abstract: "This four hour workshop or symposium will cover a biblical perspective and approach to spiritually oriented psychotherapy and inner healing prayer that will be particularly helpful to religiously committed Christian clients. A biblical perspective on human nature, as well as on effective counseling and psychotherapy will be provided. Implicit and explicit integration of Christian faith and clinical practice with cultural and ethical sensitivity will be described. The use of prayer and Scripture in therapy, including cognitive behavior therapy, will be discussed as examples of explicit integration. A seven step model of inner healing prayer or healing of painful memories will be presented, with a role play demonstration provided that this will include time for discussion."

II. Course Outline:

- a. A Biblical Perspective on Human Nature and on Effective Counseling and Psychotherapy (1 hour)
- b. Implicit and Explicit integration of Christian Faith and Clinical Practice, with Cultural and Ethical Sensitivity (0.5 hours)
- c. Use of Prayer and Scripture in Therapy, including Cognitive Behavior Therapy (0.5 hours)
- d. Seven Step Model of Inner Healing Prayer (0.5 hours)
- e. Role Play Demonstration of Inner Healing Prayer, with Discussion (1 hour)
- f. Question and Answer Session with Wrap-Up (0.5 hours)

III. Course Goals and Objectives:

Participants will:

- a. Be able to articulate a biblical perspective on human nature and thirteen principles of a biblically-based approach to effective counseling and psychotherapy.
- b. Be able to describe implicit and explicit integration of Christian faith and clinical practice with cultural and ethical sensitivity.
- c. Be able to name the seven steps of inner healing prayer and use them with clients who may benefit from this intervention in an appropriate and ethical way, including obtaining informed consent from clients.
