Asian American Christian Counseling Service (AACCS): AACCS was founded more than 33 years ago to provide professional counseling services that are culturally sensitive while also recognizing how psychology and culture intersect with issues of faith. It is a non-denominational, not for profit organization under the auspices of New Dawn Christian Family Services, Inc.

AACCS is dedicated to providing emotional healing to individuals and families, restoring broken relationships, and offering hope and guidance for positive personal change. It accomplishes its mission by providing:

- * affordable and accessible counseling and psychotherapy
- * graduate and post-graduate training of counselors and therapists who desire to serve the Asian American Christian community
- * consultation and support to pastors, churches, missionaries, and other para-church organizations
- * preventative and educational services, such as pre-marital counseling, parent education, and other speaking events

The Scholarship: The AACCS Ryo and Jean Komae Scholarship is awarded annually to help the next generation of Christian counselors with a heart to serve the Asian American community and to give these counselors encouragement in their graduate studies as they prepare to help the "brokenhearted."

<u>Two scholarships of \$2,000 will be awarded</u> in the spring of 2020 to be used for the 2020-2021 academic year. Payment will be made directly to the educational institutions of the awardees in the Fall of 2020. Each scholarship is a one-time award. In order to receive the Scholarship, recipients <u>must be present</u> at the annual AACCS' Kindness Luncheon which will be held on April 18, 2020.

Criteria for applicants:

- 1. Must be a graduate student <u>currently</u> enrolled in an accredited Marriage and Family Therapy(MFT) Program, Master in Social Work (MSW) Program or a Clinical Psychology (Psy.D/Ph.D.) Program in a Los Angeles County, Orange County, or Inland Empire college or university.
- 2. Must have an overall undergraduate and graduate school GPA of 3.3 or higher.
- 3. Must be of Asian American descent or have an interest as well as lived experience in Asian culture, languages and/or the Asian American community.
- 4. Must have a heart for and calling to bring his/her skills to the Asian American Christian community and the Asian American community at large following completion of his/her graduate program.
- 5. Must be a professing Christian as found in Romans 10:9.
- 6. Must be a regular attendee at a local church
- 7. Must be willing and available to serve as a volunteer for AACCS if awarded the scholarship (15 or more hours during the 2020-2021 school year).
- 8. <u>May not</u> be a current or former employee or independent contractor of AACCS/New Dawn; <u>may not</u> be an immediate family member (spouse, child, sibling or in-law) of a current or former employee or independent contractor of AACCS/New Dawn.
- 9. Former clients must have terminated services for two or more years.
